The Schulich Stars of MBCI By Andrew Hiebert, MBCI Physics Teacher

The Canadian Schulich Leader Scholarship is an undergraduate entrance scholarship for students intending to enroll in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) areas of study at a participating university. The Schulich Leader Scholarship was launched in 2012 by Seymour Schulich and administered by UJA (the United Jewish Appeal) Federation. Last year across Canada, the UJA Federation gave out 25 scholarships of \$80,000 for students entering engineering, and 25 scholarships of \$60,000 for students entering science or math faculties. There are currently 21 Canadian universities participating in this scholarship; the University of Manitoba is one of them. The participating universities often select only two applicants to become a 'Schulich Leader': one to their engineering program, and one to their science or math programs. Every secondary school in

Canada is able to submit ONE applicant. This applicant earns the right of being a 'Schulich Nominee'. Even being nominated for this prestigious scholarship is a great honor. The selected applicants can apply to one or more of any of the participating universities. In Manitoba alone there are 319 secondary schools, each one able to submit an applicant. Thus, a successful applicant has to outshine all of their peers within their school, and all the other 'stars' from the literally hundreds of other high schools.

At MBCI selecting our single applicant is a difficult task that is done in consultation with several science teachers, the guidance counselor, and the principals. To have a student win this scholarship once is a major reason for celebration.

I am humbled and deeply grateful to say that the quality of students we teach and develop here at MBCI are consistently remarkable. Their characters, their initiative, their love for science & engineering, and their work ethic are outstanding. This is due in no small part by their parents. In the last four years that the Schulich scholarship has been offered an MBCI student has won this extremely prestigious award **three** times!

The scholarship enables the Schulich Leader the opportunity to pursue their dreams and become the next global pioneers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, without the financial barriers that may have prevented those dreams.

Celebrities, Heroes, and Role Models - What is the difference?

This is a question that will be explored by the grade 9 students in Mr. Geddert's grade 9 Social Studies class, working together with the students in Ms. Reimer's grade 11 English class.

Students in grade 9 Social Studies study Canada's culture, its government, legal system, international relations and so much more. Throughout this course students learn of the significant individuals who have shaped and continue to shape our homeland, while the grade 11 English course focuses significantly on developing a strong writer's voice and one of the units they explore is memoirs.

With this understanding, these two teachers are embarking upon an ambitious project with their students - **THE ALUMNI PROJECT**.

The inspiration for this came in a rather unique way. As head of the Social Studies department, I (Ken Geddert) receive a great deal of correspondence related to Social Studies for all grade levels. In spring I received a government notice announcing a special program promoting the celebration of Canada's 150th birthday in 2017. The Canadian Heritage department explains that "The Canada 150 vision includes three elements:

1) Celebrating and Bringing Canadians Together:

Canadians and their communities will have opportunities to participate and celebrate together and build a deeper understanding of Canada, it's people and what it means to be Canadian.

2) Giving Back to Canada:

Canadians will be challenged to dream about what the future holds for the next 150 years, and to give back to our

country, providing meaningful change and lasting legacies for future generations.

3) Honouring the Exceptional: Exceptional Canadian people, places, achievements, and events will be showcased to help shape Canada's leaders of tomorrow."

It is specifically the third element that inspired this project. I was thinking about the many exceptional people, who have passed through the doors of MBCI, and how their stories can shape the leaders of tomorrow, specifically the students who are now or will, in the future, become our students.

How Does This Concern You?

We want to showcase some of the stories of our alumni in a published book. The stories will be researched and written by students. The process will be quite thorough, involving nominations, selection, interviews, writing, editing and rewriting, and finally publication. A culminating celebration will be planned inviting all the alumni and students who were part of this project to launch the book and celebrate our rich heritage at MBCI.

The first step in this process is to nominate individuals (or couples) from our alumni base who have a story to share. These should fit into the idea of "honouring the exceptional". Specifically, we are looking for stories that will be an encouragement and an inspiration to our students. Stories that exhibit virtues and values that make people a role model to help shape the

leaders of tomorrow. We are looking to shift the focus away from a Hollywood version of celebrity, and more towards a Hebrews 11 idea of role models.

YOUR HELP IS WANTED!

We are asking you to nominate people from the MBCI alumni who have stories that need to be shared; think of your own class and perhaps others whom you know personally.

The timeline for this project is intended to be spread over the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years. Watch for further news about this project, or check on its progress through the MBCI website.
